


Ebrary provides access to the full-text of more than 60,000 electronic books and other authoritative documents, from over 200 of the world's leading publishers.

1. Accessing ebrary


Access is available on and off campus via **MetaLib**. Select **Find database** followed by the **Titles** tab, then search for **ebrary**. The first time you use ebrary off campus you will be prompted to download and install a piece of software called the **ebrary reader**. This software will allow you to view the full-text of the documents on the screen.

2. Searching


To perform a simple search, for example: books about **tourism**, type your search term in the box.





Now click the **Search** button.

3. Limiting your search

If, as in the example shown, you have found more results than you have time to look through, think about ways of narrowing your search.

Click on the **Advanced** search tab.




