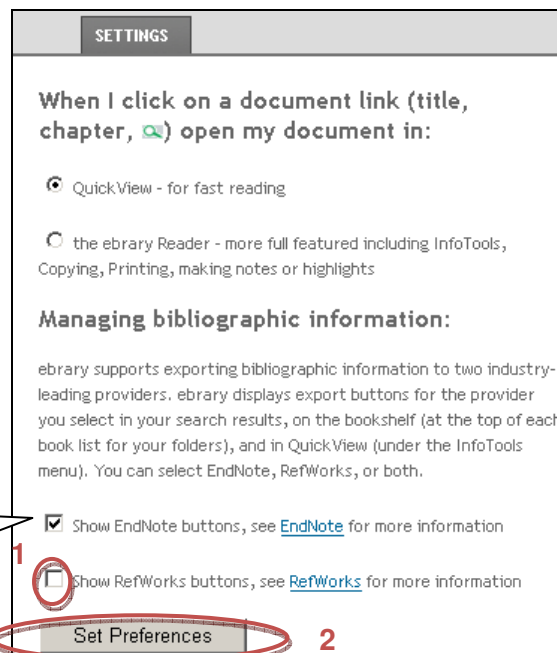
Exporting references from ebrary to EndNote

You can export references directly from **ebrary** (electronic books) into your EndNote library.

Open EndNote and create a new library, save it in an appropriate location, e.g. your K drive. Login to **ebrary** via MetaLib (<http://metalib.hud.ac.uk>)




Click on **My Settings** and the box (to the left) will appear



Tick the **EndNote** option and then **Set Preferences**

Click on search and enter some keywords...

...click on this button
